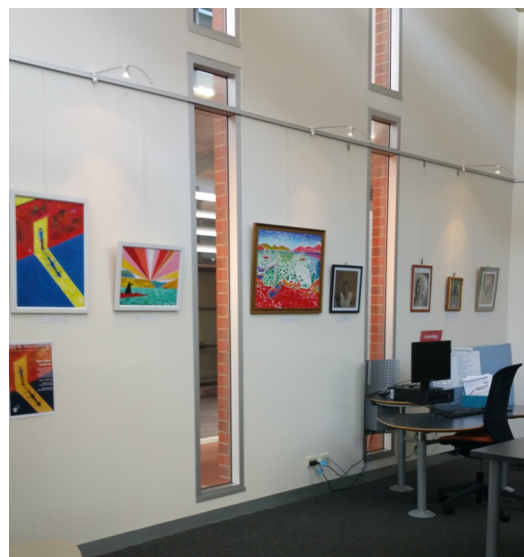

Paintings will need to have a label with artist's details and contact number and price if it is for sale - a label template will be provided by HAGAS to ensure uniformity and this will need to be attached to the painting (not the wall). All sales will be directly with the artist and paintings must remain at the library until the end of the exhibition. We may be able to have an exhibit opening at the library which will be confirmed in the next newsletter.

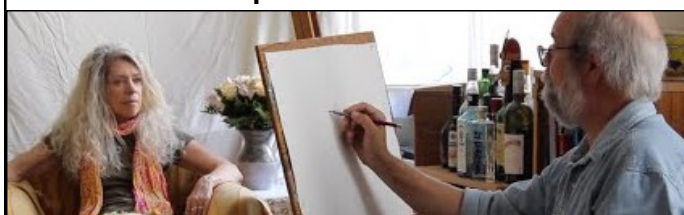
PORTRAITURE DRAWING WORKSHOP

You haven't failed if something doesn't work out. You are still inside a learning / creative process, and you have found a pivot point. It can only be a failure if you don't learnt from it.

Exploration, experimentation, discovery and uncertainty move us forward – as fearless young uninhibited children naturally demonstrate.

Unfortunately, that fearlessness is driven out with formal education where the most important thing is knowing the correct answer straight away. The pressure to be right and demonstrate what is already known, slowly erodes the 'beginners' mindset until we become uncomfortable with the unknown and are afraid and embarrassed to make mistakes.

Learn to celebrate your mistakes – even call attention to them – as this helps to convert them into valuable lessons!
